Classwork

- This may consist of textbook work, worksheets, digital files (from technology lessons), homework and informal tests (marked and returned but not formally assessed).
 - Students are expected to keep ALL their physical work in books or a folder. All digital work should be uploaded to the Google Classroom.
 - The classroom teacher may collect and mark classwork at any point during the term/topic.
 - Classwork is worth approximately 1.5% per week and will be weighted according to the length of the topic (e.g. a four-week topic is worth 6%).

Assessment

- **A formal assessment task** (an assignment) will be issued to all students. Teachers *may also* administer **formal topic exam** or a **formal end-of-term exam**, depending on the nature of the students in class.
 - The results from formal exams will replace **half** of the marks from the assessment task.
 - With **TOPIC TESTS**, students **MUST ASSUME** they will occur at the end of a topic.
 - With an **EXAM**, students **MUST ASSUME** that it will occur toward the end of term **BEFORE** the Assessment Task is due (typically in Week 8 or 9)
- **ALL formal tasks are mandatory.**
 - Tasks submitted late will lose 10% per school day, up to a maximum of 50% of the mark awarded for the task.

Criteria for Successful Completion of Course

- All students are expected to apply themselves with diligence and sustained effort to the set tasks and experiences provided in the course by the school. (ACE 4016, NESAs). Set tasks and experiences will include all classwork and assessment tasks.
- It should be noted that students are expected to be active participants in their education. While they are not expected to **complete** everything, they are expected to make a *sustained and diligent effort to try everything*.
 - Year 7 or 8 students who do not make an unreasonable attempt, or do not attempt the work, will receive zero and a letter of concern will be sent home.
 - Year 9 or 10 students who make an unreasonable attempt, or do not attempt the work, will receive zero and an N-warning letter will be sent home.
 - Unresolved N-warnings will put the attainment of their ROSA (Record of School Achievement) at risk.
